IDOWU OKENIYI

is a Nigerian - Ghanaian film director, producer and a co-founder of **Studio Reel Films**. He began his film-making career in 2008 when he shot and directed his first short film with a phone camera and using his roommates as actors. He taught himself everything he knows about filmmaking from practical experience and experimenting with friends.

Idowu's first official film was "The Special One", an adaptation of the book by Samuel Suberu Oluwasegun. It's a story about a deaf girl's struggle with ableism. His other directorial credits include two other short films that deal with societal and psychological issues: "3 Nights Ago" and "Jungle Justice". These short films have garnered a number of awards in film festivals.

DIRECTOR'S STYTEMENT

"All of my previous films deal with difficult and emotionally challenging subjects like ableism, PTSD, vigilantism. I have always taken great care to approach these subjects with empathy and sensitivity for those who have suffered; but I've also never sanitized or sugar coated that suffering either. Eshana's journey is a difficult one filled with many unpleasant twists that may be hard for viewers to watch. I am looking forward to challenging my audience to feel her pain; and feel her resentment and vulnerability. I also plan to comfort them by showing them how she is redeemed by letting go of...of her fear.



I hope that audiences will be able to see their own fears and resentments reflected in the plight of both of our main characters, Eshana and Latif. I hope that it will help them to understand how holding onto these negative emotions keeps us feeling isolated and alone. I also hope that they can see the value of letting them go, even when it seems impossible or futile to do so."

A CONVERSATION WITH CREATOR

When did you start making this film?

We began principal photography in the summer of 2023, but I really started writing the script at the height of the lockdown in 2020.

What motivated you to tell this story?

The human suffering that occurred during the pandemic was made even worse by a dramatic escalation in hate crime. I became concerned that the coded messaging of certain opinion leaders was inciting this violence and was compelled to say something about it.

What did you want to say?

In the aftermath of World War II, Maurice Ogden wrote a poem called "The Hangman" to warn us against allowing fear to control us.

Concerned that history could be repeating itself, I felt morally obligated to remind the public about his warning, but I also wanted to leave them with a sense of agency and hope.

What is "The Hangman" about?

It is about a malevolent authority figure who sows fear and confusion to subjugate the people of a small town while he systematically murders them.

How is your story different?

The protagonist of Ogden's story is an anti-hero who ultimately reaps the consequence of his moral failings. I wanted to present audiences with a hero that they could empathize with. I also wanted her to be able to stand up to the Hangman where Ogden's narrator failed.

ALEKS SPURMYNIS

Why did you choose a woman to be your hero?

My hero needed to have a very high level of emotional intelligence to be able to confront the Hangman. I thought that it would be more appropriate and believable to portray this person as a woman.

What do you want audiences take away from this film?

Being afraid of danger isn't a moral failing even when that fear can be exploited to control and dominate us. Should we find ourselves in the thrall of a "Hangman", we can regain our agency by reconnecting to our capacity for gratitude and compassion. This can be an extremely difficult thing to do, but is even possible in the aftermath of overwhelming trauma.

What is the film's connection to Islamophobia?

In the summer of 2021, a proudly multicultural community near my home was devastated by the shocking and brutal murder of a Pakistani family. The perpetrator of the crime, who targeted the victims because of their appearance, had been radicalized by the kind of coded messaging that concerned me. I wanted my story to reflect the suffering of the survivors and honor their emotional resilience.

Are Latif and Eshana an interfaith couple?

Yes. I wanted the audience to see them as a loving multicultural couple. I also wanted to open the door to exploring the complexity of their interfaith relationship in a feature-length adaptation.

Did you reach out to a disabled actor to play Eshana?

We sent out a casting call to disabled actors and corresponded with a few promising candidates. While we were unable to find a disabled actress (who could also realistically portray the able-bodied version of the character) for this film, it is an option that we intend to revisit in a feature-length adaptation.

CHYLLENGES

Some supporting crew members chose to back out participating in our production at the last moment. While co-producer Sarah Kwaji helped us recruit other talent, Executive Producer Aleks Spurmanis and his wife, Head Hairstylist Dominique Spurmanis, were forced to backfill several supporting roles. Fighting exhaustion, they succeeded in keeping our production schedule on track.



When the first Assistant Director that we hired left the project mere weeks before principal photography, co-producer **Sarah Kwaji** used her industry connections to quickly find us a trusted and capable replacement in the form of **Babatunde Agunloye**. Pearson and Steve Kasan all performed their own stunts. While Steve is a trained and seasoned stunt actor, both Tom and Brittany needed to learn some challenging new skills with the help of our knowledgeable stunt coordinator Paul Stafford.



Inspired by the iconic villain that Maurice Ogden penned in 1951, this film was originally titled **The Hangman**. As we approached the film's release date however, we discovered no less than 18 previous releases with the same title. While we renamed our production to **Eshana's Trial** as a way to differentiate it, we also feel that the new title better reflects our film's aspirational messaging.


